Goals of the "Case Anatomy Camp":

- Introduce middle and high school students to how a doctor approaches a disease
- Teach the basics of certain organ systems
- Give them the opportunity to view real human organs
- Allow them to interact with med students and ask questions
- Introduce visitors to various career options in the health sciences

You are welcome to sign up for as many sessions as you want. However, *you must attend **at least 4 sessions** to be eligible for a strong Dean's letter recognition for the 2013-2014 year.*

Structure of the session:

Most sessions will be centered on a medical case/theme

1. Visiting students will first meet in the main room and get introduced to the case
2. The students will then be divided into smaller groups that will rotate through a set of stations; each station focuses on an organ system
3. After going through all the stations, the groups will reconvene in the main room and go over the case

Different volunteer roles:

Group leaders: these volunteers will be assigned to a single group and guide students to each station; they are responsible for keeping time (up to 2 facilitators per group)

Station presenters: these volunteers sign up for a specific station and teach about that organ system; guidelines will be sent out ahead of time (at least 2 presenters per station)
