

### **NMF National Alumni Council Scholarship**

- Established to help address the severe national shortage of physician-leaders who are committed to the health of underserved communities, this award will provide a **\$5,000 scholarship to twelve (12) fourth-year underrepresented students of medicine for the 2022-2023 academic year.**
  - Eligible students have demonstrated evidence of community service and leadership potential at an early stage in their professional careers.
  - ***Application deadline: July 10, 2022 (11:59pm ET)***

### **Josiah Macy Jr. Scholarship**

- The Josiah Macy Jr. Scholarship was established in 2001 by the Josiah Macy Jr. Foundation.
  - This scholarship provides **\$5,000 to four second-year or third-year underrepresented students in medicine enrolled in an accredited U.S. medical school program for the 2022-23 academic year** and who demonstrate financial need and commitment to service.
  - ***Application deadline: July 24, 2022 (11:59pm ET)***

### **Dr. Prentiss Taylor Scholarship**

- Established in 2020, the Dr. Prentiss Taylor Scholarship in the amount of **\$5,000 will be given to one underrepresented student of medicine, who is enrolled in an accredited US medical school for the 2022-23 academic year** and has demonstrated financial need, academic excellence, leadership, and commitment to community service.
- As part of the application, students must discuss how they hope to make an impact in their career in healthcare.
- ***Application deadline: August 7, 2022 (11:59pm ET)***
